Athletic Hall of Fame*

## **I. Eligibility**

There are two categories for eligibility:

**Category A:** Student athlete

**Category B:** Administrators, Coaches, Staff Members, Others (defined as people not directly connected to the school who meet specific qualifications)

## **II. Qualifications**

### **Category A: Student-athletes**

- Must have had an outstanding athletic career at MHS
- Must have attended MHS for a minimum of TWO years
- Must have had a good attitude on and off the field
- Must have been well-behaved
- Post-graduation accomplishments should be taken into account but are not required
- Consideration may be given to academic record
- Must not have attended MHS for the past 5 years

### **Category B: Administrators, Coaches, Staff Members, Others**

#### **1. Administration and Staff Members**

- Must have worked at MHS at least 5 years
- Must have contributed greatly to the athletic program
- Must not have worked at MHS for the past 3 years (does not apply to Category A nominee)

#### **2. Coaches**

- Must have coached at MHS for at least 5 years
- Must have had an excellent coaching record
- Consideration may be given to other significant contributions to MHS Athletics
- Must be either out of coaching at MHS for 5 years (continuing to work at MHS) or not working at MHS at all for 3 years. (Does not apply to Category A nominee)

#### **3. Others**

- Must have been affiliated with MHS Athletics at least 5 years
- Must have made a major contribution of time to MHS Athletics

### III. Selection Process

#### A. Election Process

- All faculty members will be solicited for **Hall of Fame** nominees.
- The Hall of Fame voting process will be open to **ALL HEAD COACHES** and **ADMINISTRATORS**. Each will receive an email copy of the nominees, complete with their information and accomplishments, as well as a ballot. Each person will be asked to return their ballots by a set date. The votes will be tallied by the Athletic Department and the results released the following day. Those that earn 65% of the available points will be inducted this year.

#### B. Process

- All previous year's nominees (meeting requirements) must be listed as well as current Hall of Fame members.
- Nomination forms must be emailed to MHS-ALL in March.
- Anyone may submit nominations for consideration (faculty, staff, MHS alumni, former or present coach, etc.).
- Nominees will be notified by letter of their nomination and asked to submit additional biographical information, by Sept 1st, for the voters to review.
- Nominations should include statistics, achievements, awards, character, etc.
- Induction ballots and necessary information on each nominee will be given to the voters by the AD for review prior to the Hall of Fame vote.
- The AD will provide the voters a ballot with the list of candidates in alphabetical order.
- The voting process will be conducted as Follows:
  1. The selection process for Category A nominees is based on a point-percentage system.
  2. Category B nominees must receive 75% of committee member votes to be inducted
  3. For Category A nominees, each nominee will be ranked in order by each committee member, with their top selection receiving the number of points corresponding to the total number of nominees.
    - Example: there are 15 nominees on the ballot
    - Each committee member ranks each individual from 1-15
    - #1 - 15 points
    - #2 - 14 points
    - #3 - 13 points
    - .
    - .
    - .
    - #15 - 1 point
  4. A nominee must receive at least 65% of the available points to be inducted. In the above example, there is a maximum of 105 points (7 voters, max 15 points per vote).  $65\% = 68.25$  points, hence, a nominee must have earned at least 68 points to be inducted.
  5. No more than a maximum of three new inductees from Category A and two from category B may be inducted each year.

6. The Principal, or his/her designee, may override the above rules if he/she sees fit, regardless of the maximum requirements.
7. Should a tie in points occur between nominees receiving (1) better than the minimum required amount of points for induction, (2) the maximum number of inductees has been reached, and (3) no override is exercised, then the committee will vote to decide which inductee is included in the current year's class. Each member will have one vote; the nominee with the most votes from the committee is inducted.
8. There is no minimum amount of inductees per year.
9. Should a nominee not be elected into the Hall of Fame, their name automatically carries over to the following year's election process provided they have received at least 40% of the available points. In the above example, the nominee would have to receive 42 of the available 105 points to carry over to the following year's vote.
10. Those not receiving at least 40% of the available points are removed from the following year's ballot and must be re-nominated to appear on future ballots.
11. The selection process for Category B nominees will be equal to Category A. A nominee must receive at least 75% of the votes to be inducted.
12. Any interpretations of these policies will be made by the Principal, or in his absence, the Athletic Director.
13. The inductees will be honored at the Hall of Fame Football game at Halftime.
